## Principal's Welcome

Well, what a term it has been!

I have to say that I have been blown away by our student and staff's hard work, dedication and commitment over the last six weeks. Together, we have achieved a pass rate of 60% during GCSE and Maths resits, supported pupils to sit 386 exam papers in January, helped 105 students apply for University through UCAS and supported another 25% of our students to secure apprentice-

ships all whilst achieving a 90% attendance rate!

Our staff have worked incredibly hard to offer live lessons to the normal teaching timetable, adapting their planning and pedagogy to adapt to a style of teaching that was completely alien to them less than a year ago.

Our students have shown real commitment to their studies and I know are currently revising hard for the assessment window that will open when we come back.

I am deeply proud to be leading such a community and would like to thank you all as parents and carers for the hard work and support that you have demonstrated over the course of this term.

I hope that you will be able to enjoy some well-earned rest over the next week and we look forward to keeping you informed about next steps as soon as we know more ourselves.



## **Teaching and Learning**

#### **Lessons in Term 4**

Lessons will take place according to normal timetables for the first four days back.

Between 26th-Feb-5th March, most students will be taking assessments online. This will mean that most lessons, as well as assemblies and Academic Mentoring sessions, will not be taking place.

Some vocational lessons where assessment is continuous may still be having lessons so please encourage your son/daughter to check with their teacher if they are not sure.



We will continue to deliver online learning until the government has been able to confirm that schools can be opened safely.

#### **Assessments in Term 4**



As per our last letter, assessments will be taking place online between 26th Feb-March 5th.

If your son / daughter has approved exam access arrangements and they would benefit from having this support on site, <u>complete this short form</u> (with COVID 19 risk management measures in place) to register an on-site place.

## Your feedback on teaching and learning

Thank you to everyone who took the time to fill out the <u>Remote Learning Survey</u>, your answers will help us to shape how we do things going forward.

We were overwhelmed by your responses, with over 85% of you declaring that you are "Very Satisfied" or "Quite Satisfied" with remote teaching (with 0% Quite Dissatisfied or Very Dissatisfied") and comments like the following:

#### **Academic Coaches**

We have used the 18-19 Tuition Fund from the government to employ three Academic Coaches who started at the beginning of the term.

Michael, Natasha and Jack have been supporting students with a variety of subjects on a one-to-one or small group basis and have made a significant difference to their progress already.

We are delighted to say that we will be continuing this work until the end of the June.
