Please can you remind your young person that students should leave site as soon as their final lesson for that day has finished, we currently have groups of students socialising around site, that we are unable to supervise.

Meningitis – MenB Vaccine

Further to our recent communication regarding Health Guidance following the number of meningitis cases in Kent and checking your child is up to date with their vaccinations, we also wanted to share the following information regarding the MenB vaccine.

The MenB vaccine is not routinely offered on the NHS to anyone born before 2015, as it was only added to the childhood schedule for babies from September 2015 onwards. This means that most current secondary and post-16 students will not have received MenB as part of routine immunisations.

If families wish to access the MenB vaccine, it must, currently, be obtained privately. It is available through national pharmacy chains such as:

- **Boots** – offering the MenB (Bexsero) vaccine privately for adults and children aged 2+.
- **Superdrug** – also offers private MenB vaccinations, although some branches are currently experiencing high demand and limited stock.

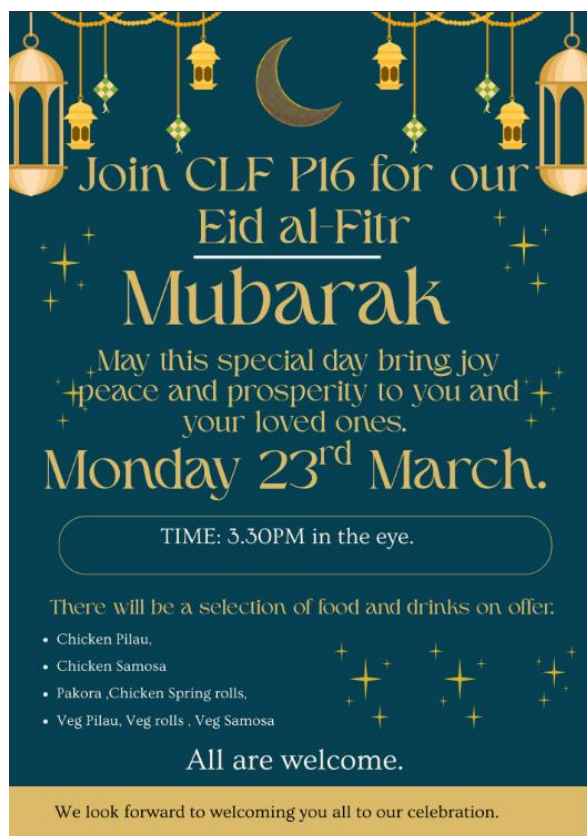
Appointments can be booked online via the pharmacy websites.

We recognise that the cost of the MenB vaccine can make it inaccessible for many families, and it's important to reassure students that the MenACWY vaccine still provides protection against four major meningococcal strains (A, C, W and Y). While it does not protect against MenB, it remains a vital and effective part of meningitis prevention.

If students or families have questions or concerns, they are encouraged to speak with their GP
