- Students must check the portal and be aware of their seat number before entering the exam.

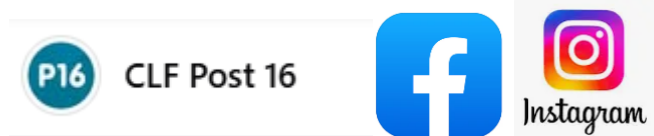
Year 12 Parents Evening – 10th June
