
From all the staff at CLF Post 16 have a restful break and 'Happy Easter'.

More than 20 students were involved as performers, technicians, designers and backstage crew. Our preview performance at JCA was well attended by parents and friends, and we received some useful and encouraging feedback from a National Theatre Director to help us elevate our performance in time for the

showing at Bristol Old Vic which took place on Tuesday 19th March.

We had a very long day at the theatre before our 8.30pm performance but the time spent rehearsing in the space and working with the theatre team and technicians was an incredible experience.

We were all extremely proud of the final result and were really grateful to all the parents, carers, friends and staff who supported the project in development and on the night.

Well done team!






International Women's Day


Challenge 2: Strike the #InspireInclusion pose -- to show solidarity as true inclusion comes from the heart.




Pi Day!
