

PLAGIARISM & AI ADVICE

Key factors to allow us to authenticate work

- ★ The teacher has seen the student develop the work. This means attendance to lessons is essential
- ★ The student can explain their work
- ★ The student is clearly referencing any sources used
- ★ The work is in a similar writing style to other work produced by the student

AI use policy – generic across all

AI use	Example	Allowed
Research	Asking AI a question such as 'name 5 theorists that agree with x' to start your research on a topic. Asking AI what a concept means	Yes *Follow guidance from your teachers on the accuracy of AI for your subjects
Structuring work and checking for small grammar errors	Asking AI for a general structure for a particular type of writing e.g. 'Suggest a structure to answer a 20-mark AQA A-Level Geography essay' Use AI tools such as Grammarly to correct small mistakes	Yes *Follow guidance from your teachers on the accuracy of AI for your subjects
Using AI to generate Text or images	Prompting AI to answer the criteria that you are working on Asking AI to generate a plan for a specific piece of writing	No

Referencing AI use

In-text citation

(ChatGPT, 2023)

Reference list

ChatGPT. (2023, January 18). Prompt How do you cite an answer in ChatGPT?
Answer: Response to user question.
Retrieved from (URL of the platform where the conversation took place).
