Work experience is compulsory for all Year 12 students.

Why do work experience?

Whatever job or career you want, you will learn more about yourself and working life. The skills you gain in the process and the experiences you have will make any applications you make stronger; for university, apprenticeship or employment. You will stand out from the crowd.

On work experience placements you will find out more about yourself, what inspires you and discover your strengths, values, motivations and interests. You will meet new people and build your network of contacts. Work experience can also help you to rule out certain options and focus your career ideas.

Work experience for CLF Post 16 is 15th to 19th July 2024 but some students find suitable placements during the year.



CLF Post <u>16</u>: Work Experience Process for Y12 students



Work Experience has proven to help students make positive career decisions and promotes employability skills including communication and organisation. Placements will help students strengthen their applications for apprenticeships, jobs or universities and make them stand out. For some courses, work experience is a compulsory part of the entry requirements.

All year 12 students must complete work experience (in person or virtual) over 3 days, using one or more placements; this is one of the conditions of entry into Year 13. You must follow the process below.

The Process:

1	Begin looking for work experience now: Email businesses, to into organisations, speak to family and friends in the world of work, and apply for opportunities online, check out the Career Bulletin for opportunities. It is likely you will need to work hard to find a placement so keep trying!
2	Complete Forms: When you have organised a <u>placement</u> you will need to get your employer to complete the electronic "Employer Agreement" and your parent/carer will need to complete the electronic "Student-Parent Agreement". These forms MUST be completed before the placement. Email Kate or Rochelle if you need the links.
3	Prepare for your placement: Read any paperwork your employer sends you as it is likely to contain important information. Ensure you have transport arranged and that you know your timings. Make sure you have the necessary clothing organised if something specific is required.
4	Undertake Work Experience Complete your placement – remember to take notes daily of what tasks you do, the organisation details etc. as this will be necessary for your CV and to applications for apprenticeships, jobs and university courses.

If <u>you</u> secure work experience during the academic year, and complete the process above for your placement to be <u>authorised</u> by the Careers Team, then you will not have to find a place during the last week of term or be expected to attend lessons.

Remember, work experience is compulsory for a reason: it represents one of the best chances you have to engage in the world of work and develop your employability skills.

Good luck and remember three things:

Begin looking for a placement <u>now</u>
Seek help if you're <u>stuck</u>
Make this time count by making the most of your experience.





Routes into STEM Virtual Experience 2023/24

Routes into STEM virtual experience provides an exciting opportunity to explore the various routes you can take towards your STEM career. This course is designed to enable young people to work through activities and projects at their own pace, tour a variety of institutions virtually and also have access to live career sessions and mentor panels with STEM employers.

Who is it for?

- Students in Year 9 or 10 / S3 or S4 / equivalent who are interested in exploring a career in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths)
- All you need is an interest in STEM and curiosity about the future. The course is open to all
 academic abilities

What's involved?

- · Approximately 20 hours of study virtually at a pace that suits you
- Exploring different Routes into a STEM career including College Courses, University Courses, and Apprenticeships and learning from industry what is involved in a STEM career as well as enhancing your skills
- Live interactive sessions over the half-term breaks, school holidays and after school, allowing
 you to listen and ask questions to STEM students and professionals
